II. Approve minutes

- The December 2011 meeting minutes were approved as written. Motion to approve made by CDR Barton-Behravesh and seconded by LCDR Davidson.

III. CPO Comments: CAPT Clark

- Hello and welcome to 2012. I appreciate the enthusiasm you all have for accomplishing great things in the new year.
- RADM Lushniak informed the CPOs that new guidelines will be coming out for the new ODUs (Operational Dress Uniform) & Regular Corps implementation in the next few months.
- Please verify that your documents were successfully loaded into your eOPF if you are up for promotion this year, and send me or LCDR Bair-Brake an email if you have noticed any discrepancies.
- Thanks to LCDR Bair Brake -- we appreciate her efforts as PAC chair for this year. She has been preparing with CDR Gibbins and myself and will do a great job over the next several months.
- The recent accessions process changes that occurred in the start of 2012 should not be viewed to be the same as the hiring pause that we encountered previously. Although new veterinary applications are not currently being accepted, this is being done in order to deal with the backlog of pending applications with the staff level available to process them. Recruitment efforts should still be carried out, as it is expected to resolve quickly.

IV. VetPAC Chair Comments: LCDR Bair-Brake

- Congratulations to two new Veterinary Officers who recently completed OBC: LT Samantha Pinizzotto, FDA & LCDR Evan Shukan, NIH.
- Congrats to LCDR Lauren Davidson on being selected as a voting member of the new PHS Women's Issues Advisory Board.
- Thank you to those who helped with reviewing and responding to the Surgeon General and National Prevention Council's National Prevention Strategy document.
- We are still working out details with Coast Guard and expecting an announcement in May about introducing the all-blue ODUs as an optional PHS uniform. Once they are available and guidelines are in place for their use, there will be a one year phase-out of the woodland BDUs.

VI. Subcommittee Business

Awards: CDR Barton Behravesh

- Call for Veterinarian of the Year has gone out, applications due April 6.
- CAPT Clark noted that we had one submission for the Salmon Award this year, and we have two Unit Commendations pending: VPAC Website subcommittee for their efforts in revamping our PAC website and a larger, all categories, UC for our collective efforts in meeting the CC transformation goals for basic readiness qualifications.

Career Development: CAPT Altekruise

- CAPT Clark has been working to develop a roster of O-6 and senior Veterinary Officers in the DC area who are willing and able to attend the OBC graduation ceremonies when we have a new Veterinary Officer in the course, to facilitate easier planning.

Meetings: LCDR Duncan

- The Central Veterinary Conference will be occurring in the DC area April 26-29. They are looking for moderators, which will earn free attendance to the conference. If you are interested, look at the article in the Vet Bites newsletter for more information.
- USPHS Scientific Training Symposium will be occurring at the University of Maryland-College Park June 19-21. For veterinary category day, we are planning a morning lecture and afternoon wet lab at the campus farm which has dairy cattle, sheep, & horses. We are working to have veterinary CE hours available for this meeting.
- LCDR Bair-Brake reported that PHS will be organizing the 2013 AMSUS conference, and wanted to include a veterinary category member to participate in the planning committee. Dr. Sarah Babcock has volunteered to serve on this committee, and any additional interested category members are welcomed to join her.

Readiness: CDR Julie Sinclair

- Started attending weekly OFRD calls—nothing new to report from yesterday's meeting.
- LCDR Damon Smith said that category readiness stats as of the end of December 2011 will be out at end of this month.
- 5 officers will be attending DOD Veterinary Stability Ops course at the end of this month. In discussions with Maj Paul Hollier, the Army's course coordinator, this course is a good venue for PHS Officers to interact with Army and Air Force Veterinary Officers in a relaxed and informative atmosphere.
- We are awaiting word from the Coast Guard regarding the status of a 2012 Arctic humanitarian mission.

Recruitment/Retention: LCDR Davidson

- We are still receiving CVs from veterinarians interested in joining PHS and we would like to encourage new recruits in spite of current pause in application processing.
- Supports CAPT Clark's effort of having a roster of DC area vet officers to welcome new officers to allow for better planning to cover this duty.

Website: Dr. Langer

- The public side of the PHS website is being redesigned, which means that the veterinary category website will also be redesigned. CDR Jarman is working on getting the site updated in line with the new template.
- The HHS Portal site for the PAC is transitioning to a fee-for-service model and we will discontinue it shortly. Please remove any documents that are located on it that you do not want to lose. We are working to archive its content. We are also looking to determine what potential replacements might be available, if any. Contact Dr. Langer or CDR Buss if you have any comments or suggestions. Because the portal has not been widely used in the last year, we are less inclined to replace the site. Another option is creating a members-only password-protected section to the PHS veterinary category website.

- LCDR Bair-Brake noted that this is JOAG's 10th anniversary and a celebration is planned at the PHS symposium.

IX. NAFV Update: CDR Montgomery

- The Talent Management Advisory Council recently had a meeting regarding Federal workforce recruitment & retention-- an assessment of veterinary assets across all federal agencies is ongoing. In the event of an exotic animal disease outbreak response, the current federal vet workforce would have a large shortage.
- In USDA, FSIS has had to close district offices and 4 area APHIS offices and hiring bonuses for FSIS public health veterinarians have been cut due to budgetary concerns.

II. Approve minutes

The October 2011 meeting minutes were approved as written. Motion to approve made by LCDR Hale and seconded by CAPT Altekruise.

III. CPO Comments: CAPT Clark

- Best wishes for a Happy Holidays and Merry Christmas to all officers. Thanks for the work everyone is doing for the Corps and their agencies on a daily basis.
- Thanks to CAPT Wright and LCDR Bair-Brake, for their assistance during the visit to CDC on November 18-19 and to all the officers who took the time to meet with CAPT Clark. It was very enlightening and educational to see how CDC works and great to meet officers face to face and get to know better. Hoping to come back to Atlanta again for EIS Conference.
- The category presented a print to CAPT Mainzer in thanks for his many years of service. CAPT Wright is working on getting it matted and framed and will send out a picture to the category when CAPT Mainzer receives it.
- CAPT Clark has had many wonderful conversations while providing information and mentorship in preparation for promotion boards. She is impressed with the level of professionalism and quality of veterinary officers in the Corps, and the education, motivation, and strength of individuals as well as how strong we are as a group. It has been a privilege to get to know officers better.
- Sent out information to listserv on web-based MPH program through the University of Iowa, in which LCDR Wilson is currently enrolled. Commend officers for doing that and wish there was more funding available for long-term training. Officers should remember the GI bill is available to help with costs for those interested in pursuing more education.
- Also sent details for joining the Army-managed study group for officers who are planning to take the ACVPM boards. ACVPM boards have increased in breadth and width of information over the years, and it currently requires mastery of an impressive amount of knowledge to take and pass. Preparing for and taking boards requires and huge commitment, and being involved in a study group or pairing up with other officers is critical in staying motivated. The Army-run groups do a great job and are a mix of civilians and officers, so please take advantage of the opportunity.
- Final spreadsheet for the billet selection process has been received. Information needs to be turned around by middle of January, but should be pretty straightforward. Will engage senior officers to help evaluate the consistency of the positions across agencies. Hopes that since these will be on Direct Access by mid-February the will be in place for the 2012 promotions, but will try to get further clarification on this.

- New procedure for application process has been announced and will be curious to hear additional details at the CPO board meeting next week. It was disheartening to see that vets were not placed in a priority group, but not terribly surprising. Probably not a lot of recourse at this time, but have asked how Agencies can provide input so that VC officers can be elevated in their accession status once the current restrictions are lifted. If you have questions about the new process, please ask CDR Gibbins or CAPT Clark.
- Comment from an officer that it was concerning that the multidisciplinary billet had no option to select any medical experience needed/valuable for the position. Unfortunately the category did not have much influence on what was included in the multidisciplinary billet, which was why officers were encouraged to choose a category-specific billet. Once they stand-up the billets in mid-February, there should be an opportunity to re-evaluate for those who were in transition or feel that their billet doesn't capture their job requirements. Suggest officers work with agency to try to change it to a category-specific billet. If there are officers who are up for promotion that feel their billet doesn't reflect their training/certifications, be sure to include it in the CV, officer statement, etc. so that is captured in the promotion package.
- Welcome to new PAC members, especially CDR Gibbins who signed up to serve another three year term on the PAC. Also thanks to CDR Gibbins for his service to the PAC over the previous year.

IV. Special Presentation: CDR Paul Reed

- OFRD has experienced quite a bit of change in organization due to greater changes in OSG. OFRD is currently at 40% of previous staffing levels and lost 6 FTE billets and 1 FTE admin support staff. CDR Reed will be moving into the Medical Reserve Corps leadership as of next week.
- Global response position has been eliminated at this point and nothing on the horizon to suggest that re-engagement in global health will be a PHS priority. Officers may still engage in international deployments through their jobs. This change is despite recognition from partners, including DoD, of the contribution PHS officers make in global health activities.
- OFRD currently has a handful of ongoing missions. The only upcoming mission is to provide medical support for the State of the Union address.
- On training side, it appears funding for Tier 1 and Tier 2 assets will be somewhat intact in next FY and the intent is to continue previous focus on service-oriented missions to provide care to underserved population which aligns well with goals of OASH. Waiting on budget approval.
- CAPT Beck should have sent messaging on OFRD account regarding readiness. December readiness run was completed as of last week.
- Until last week there was a serious disconnect between databases—OFRD and Direct Access pages did not accurately reflect officers' readiness status. Should be resolved now. Messages should have gone out on 12/5 to officers who were not basic ready. Please contact OFRD to resolve any issues or concerns if you think you received one in error.
- Best way to contact OFRD regarding Direct Access and readiness issues is to use the form e-mail that was sent out to all officers. Expect at least 48 hour lag time for a response.
- Attempting to develop an SOP for joint recognition of activations of the CDC EOC and ASPER operations which would allow the agencies a better opportunity to take advantage of officers to expand response capacity. This would allow CDC to request officers during EOC activations, but it is unknown whether officers could also be requested to backfill CDC positions.

V. Vet PAC Chair Comments: CDR Gibbins

- Combined SGPAC/CPO call
 - Set for next week. Any time sensitive issues will be sent out via listserv if something comes up that the Category needs to know about
 - Involuntary separation policy is tied to the reason there has been a stall on regular corps appointment status. With all officers now regular corps, procedures needed to be changed. Officers would be CAD in a 3 year probation status, officer performance will be reviewed at end of the 3 years, and if not retained would be eligible for 6 months separation pay. After final resolution of this issue, expect that the move to regular status should be able to move forward soon.
- Deadlines for promotion are fast approaching or have approached so keep an eye out.
- Category charter is usually due every 3 years, but since there is a model charter in the works the category has been given a couple of extra months.
- Good, tentative agenda for CVC conference has been arranged. Speaker slots have been filled, but still plenty of room for moderators. If you are interested in giving a talk, please let CDR Gibbins know in case anyone cancels or schedules change.
- New Vet PAC members for 2012 has gone forward and been approved by SG. CAPT Hampshire, LCDR Duncan, LCDR Bosch, and CDR Gibbins should have received their letters of appointment. LCDR Bair-Brake will be taking over as Chair in January. Will also want to determine chair and subcommittee assignments soon and start thinking about selection of a PAC chair elect early in the next year
- Thanks to CAPT Mainzer and CAPT Clark for their help and mentorship as CPO this year. Thanks to former PAC chairs that provided advice, to LCDR Bair-Brake for filling in on calls, PAC members and category members who volunteered to work on committees, including the billet process, national prevention strategy, and CV summary and revisions committees. Also thanks to those who attended OBC to welcome new officers to the Category and volunteered to serve on appointment or promotion boards.
- JOAG representative, LCDR Willy Lanier couldn't make the call, but if any junior officers are not on the JOAG listserv let him know, or if any junior officers are willing to be involved on a committee or subcommittee. Will add JOAG update as a standing agenda item after the first of the year.

VI. Subcommittee Business

Awards: CDR Barton Behravesh

- Call for nominations for the Junior Vet of the Year and the Vet Responder are due by COB Dec 9. Haven't received many nominations yet, so please get them in. If you need more information, contact CDR Barton Behravesh.
- Deadline for the Dr. Daniel E. Salmon award was Dec 2nd and received one nomination which will go forward through the CPO and OSG.
- Certificates of appreciation for the PAC have been sent out and certificates for CVC moderators are currently in progress and should be sent out soon. If you were expecting a certificate and didn't receive one, please let LCDR Barton Behravesh know.

Career Development: CAPT Altekruse

- Look forward to getting recommendations on directions to go next year following completion of the CV workgroup. Guidance has been sent out the listserv and is now on website as well.

- Members of CV workgroup (CAPT Carter, CAPT Altekruise, LCDR Knust, LCDR Duncan) would be happy to talk to people that might need assistance, guidance, answer questions, etc.

Meetings: LCDR Bair-Brake, LCDR Duncan

- USPHS Symposium — Washington, DC, June 19-21, 2012
 - Will be held at the University of Maryland Student Union in College Park.
 - Since conference is so short, decided to have wet lab on the afternoon of category day.
 - College of Agriculture located on the College Park campus and has some vet faculty who will help.
 - For Category Day, will have PHS officers speaking in the morning and National Aquarium speakers during lunch.
 - Working on getting veterinary CE for the conference this year. LCDR Duncan will be on COA committee to help facilitate this.
 - Hope many officers will be able to attend.
- For officers not on the East Coast there are opportunities to participate in other CVC meetings. Would like to have PHS tracks, speakers at all 3 conferences, but can't commit to providing a full day at each conference. However, if there are officers that would like to get on the schedule for the Central Conference or the San Diego Conference, let CDR Gibbins know and he can put you in touch with Dr. Davis and the conference organizers. Moderators who moderate 1.5 days will receive complimentary registration for entire conference.
- CAPT Clark may want to review presentations and moderator duties to determine whether officers should be in uniform or in a non-duty status during the conference since officers in a regulatory billet may need to be careful about the appearance of conflicts of interest.

Readiness: CDR Gibbins

- CDR Sinclair sent out info regarding upcoming DoD Stability course in Jan-Feb in Athens, GA. No charge for course, but travel and per diem are not covered. Will offer up to 8 slots for PHS officers for the course.
- Preliminary work by USCG to fund 2012 Artic Missions has started with more to come later.

Recruitment/Retention: LCDR Davidson

- Everyone should have received email regarding application changes. Vet category will focus on those that have their applications in to try to find positions for those individuals.
- If individuals can get an application submitted by 12/31 their application will still be considered. For individuals who are interested in PHS, but don't apply by then, they will be encouraged to find positions, and then can apply for PHS once the new application guidelines are changed.
- Have asked how long the new applicant policy will last but have not received an answer. Stats suggest they have more than double the normal amount to process and staff has been

reduced, so they are hopeful it will only be for a year or so, but no firm timeline. Will let the category know when they get a definite answer.

- A new vet officer will be graduating from OBC on 12/16/11, so if any senior officers are available to attend, please let LCDR Davidson know.

Website: CDR Buss

- We have started the analysis of the Needs Assessment survey (completed by 35 persons). Crude analysis is completed and we are now working on a more in-depth analysis. Once completed, we will be working on a report of the findings.
- CDR Jarman has finalized the Web-site Content Management System (CMS). He has used the CMS to manage the veterinary category site for the past 6-7 months. During this time, he has identified ways to improve the system for persons with limited technical skills. He plans to provide training to the subcommittee so that our group can use the CMS to manage the site. In the interim, CDR Jarman will continue to work on updates to the category Website as needed. <http://www.usphs.gov/corpslinks/Veterinarian/>
- He has requested that the Vet. Category CPO information on the PHS public veterinary website (<http://usphs.gov/profession/veterinarian/>) be updated as it is not current.
- We also need to replace the BIOs on the PHS public veterinary website and would ask the recruitment sub-committee and LCDR Davidson to provide information to get the page (<http://usphs.gov/profession/veterinarian/bios.aspx>) updated.
- I would like to thank all that have served on our sub-committee this year. Adam Langer, Dwayne Jarman, Stacy Holzbauer, Sherry Burrer, and Catherine Rockwell. To maintain continuity, all have agreed to continue serving in the upcoming year (2012) if agreeable to the VetPAC members and incoming Chair. CDR Buss is willing to continue to serve as Web-site Sub-committee chair and Dr. Adam Langer is willing to continue as Co-Chair.
- Also, thanks to CDR Gibbins for his continuing leadership to assist and help guide our activities in the past year.

VII. Workgroup Updates:

Uniform Standards: CDR Campbell

- The PHS BDU has now been phased out by DoD, so keep this in mind if you wear them on a military installation or receive comments from DoD personnel.
- Received notification from RADM Canton that the guidance would be coming out soon.
- Will be taken off of standing agenda since workgroup no longer active.

VIII. COA Update: CDR Gibbins

- Encourage officers to join COA. COA has been instrumental in 9-11 transferability and other PHS issues.

IX. NAFV Update: CDR Montgomery

- NAFV working on the veterinary work force issue. Members completed the annual survey which will be sent to CDR Gibbins to share. Currently 3,175 vets in federal workforce.

II. Approve minutes

- The September 2011 meeting minutes were approved as written. Motion to approve made by CDR Barton Behraves and seconded by LCDR Wilson.

III. CPO Comments: CAPT Clark

- Formal and official thanks for all of CAPT Mainzer's hard work and efforts as CPO.
- Very excited about the opportunity to serve the PAC in this capacity. Thanks to everyone for their help in settling in to this new position, particularly CDR Gibbins and LCDR Bair-Brake.
- Thanks to LCDR Davidson and CAPT Spires for submitting packages for Commissioned Corps Women's Issues Advisory Board.
- Thanks to the officers who helped out with the Commissioned Corps accession prioritization issues.
- VPAC CV subcommittee met again and are trying to make final minor changes to the CV summary so that this could be reviewed at this VPAC meeting and posted. This new CV summary should be used by officers preparing for the 2012 promotion cycle.
- For officers in Atlanta, CAPT Clark is tentatively scheduling a visit on November 17-18, 2011 and would like to have lunch and a meet and greet with Atlanta officers on the 18th if possible.
- Will be sending out information on annual medical history forms. Annual medical history form is considered an operational requirement, and is not taken into account when basic readiness status is assessed. However, for officers up for permanent promotion, a current annual medical history form needs to be on file both when the packet is going forward for review and when the orders are issued. Annual medical history forms do not require a physician signature except for the years it is completed in conjunction with the 5 year physical examination.

- OFRD is aware of problems in Direct Access with error messages when readiness status is checked. They are expecting to put out a notification later today about the issue.
- Fall readiness notifications will not be sent out, but readiness notifications for December and March will occur to verify basic readiness requirements are met, particularly for those officers up for promotion. Make sure to keep records when documents are faxed in (i.e. transmission logs) to verify that you have provided information by the December 31st deadline. If any discrepancy were to occur, DCCPR will want to see documentation to allow adding information into your OPF after December 31st for inclusion in the promotion board.
- A few officers have received the original billet email, but haven't completed the billet selection. Has been some confusion on how to select the appropriate level for your billet. Will try to provide clarification if you are still having problems. After the officers/supervisors have done their part, they will come back to Vet PAC to make sure billet descriptions look reasonable and consistent. If you have questions, call CAPT Clark or CDR Gibbins. Final review must be done by mid-January, so must be completed by December.

IV. Vet PAC Chair Comments: CDR Gibbins

 - Orders for past promotions and regular corps are still being worked out due to the reorganization.
 - Global Health Awards policies are still being put into place.

II. Approve minutes

The August 2011 meeting minutes were approved as written. Motion to approve made by LCDR Hale and seconded by CDR Campbell.

III. CPO Comments: CAPT Mainzer

- Both category-specific and multidisciplinary billets are coming out at the same time and there are lots of questions on how to determine billets. As you go through the billet process, think about what you do and what are fundamental competencies and abilities required by your position. Some officers may think their billet is multidisciplinary, but may actually be category-specific since clinical training, board certification, etc is required. If you are determined to be in a category-specific billet, your OPDIV will not be locked into hiring another veterinarian to replace you in the future, but it does help define what we do as veterinarians in the PHS. The role of vets in public health was highlighted again by a recent information request from the legislature. If what you do requires what you learned as a veterinarian, then you should be in a category-specific billet. If your supervisor doesn't agree that your role requires your veterinary training, please let CAPT Mainzer know, however the ultimate decision will be made at OPDIV level.
- Received a few calls from Tier 1 and particularly Tier 2 requesting veterinarians for their response teams. Applied Public Health teams in particular are looking for vets with preventive medicine and epidemiology training. Interested officers should contact CAPT Mainzer to get in touch with team commanders or e-mail LCDR Damon Smith with OCCO for more information regarding the teams. LCDR Smith can also distribute interested officers' CVs for the teams to look at. Most vets should probably be on an RDF (clinical) or APH (epi or prev med) team.
- Some new veterinary officers were recently approved by the Senate to positions in PHS and look forward to serving with them.
- Category is facing restrictions on T&E assigned to incoming applicants. CAPT Mainzer is actively pursuing action to change these limitations and hopes this can be rectified in the upcoming weeks.

- Congrats to CAPT Treadwell for her part in the 9/11 commemoration publication that CAPT Mainzer will forward to the category.
- Announcement has been sent out for the Armed Forces Joint Public Health conference in June. All officers are encouraged to submit an abstract. Abstracts are due Oct. 25, 2011. CE hours will be offered for veterinarians.
- USPHS Training Symposium will also be held in June 2012 in Washington, DC
- CAPT Mainzer's successor as CPO should be named shortly.
- In response to a GAO report regarding the shortage of vets in federal government, the Category and NAFV will be working with OPM to understand what vets do to protect agriculture and public health as well as recruit new vets through Commissioned Corps and civil service. The VA is also looking at giving comparability allowances to vets (as they do for MDs) for the first time. Recent congressional hearing focused mostly on vets working in food safety and agriculture health.
- CAPT Mainzer has awards for several officers in the DC area and will be contacting them by email to schedule when to present them.

IV. Vet PAC Chair Comments: CDR Gibbins

- Combined SGPAC/CPO call will be held next Wednesday so no current updates.
- On the PAC Chairs meeting furloughs are still under discussion.
- Next list of nominees has gone forward to the Senate with several veterinarians on it.
- Multidisciplinary billet process is currently under way
- Would like to recognize CAPT Spires as the new COA Board of Directors Chair
- Congrats to LCDR Willie Lanier as our Category rep to the JOAG board. Thanks to LCDR Bair-Brake for her service in this position.
- Vet PAC is in the beginning stages of partnering with P-PAC to address concerns with pre-deployment, deployment, and post-deployment issues. Want to make sure officers are physically and mentally fit before and after deployment. LCDR Shibukawa-Kent will be working on this issue for our category.
- CAPT Bailey has requested officers please go through category reps first for billet clarification before contacting him due to the large number of questions he is currently receiving. For category-specific billets, billet descriptions (APH 1, 2, 3, and 4) do not necessarily correlate to grade (O-3, O-4, O-5, and O-6) depending on other duties and responsibilities.

V. Special Presentation: LCDR Kennedy and LCDR Freedman

- Presentation slides have been sent out to the listerv
- LCDR Kennedy and LCDR Freedman were deployed June 18–July 2, 2011 on a joint mission with USCG, Artic Shield. Officers were headquartered out of Barrow, AK and worked in communities on the North Slope providing immunizations, rabies prophylaxis, and castration services.
- Barrow, AK is the northernmost city in the U.S. On trips to surrounding villages (pop 200-400), each household was visited on foot. Rabies prophylaxis was administered to dogs and cats (120 doses), and rabies certs and tags were also issued. Additionally, 25 doses of distemper/parvo vaccine and a couple of panleukopenia vaccines were administered. Several castrations were also performed under injectable anesthesia.
- High demand for spays as well, but due to limited anesthesia and inappropriate surgery locations (often garages or sheds) were not able to perform that service on this mission

- Kids were out of school and followed officers around, so used the time to educate them on the importance of rabies prophylaxis, purpose of the mission, etc. Also were approached by people to relinquish pets, including 2 parakeets and 2 dogs.
- In Barrow, officers educated 21 middle school students about careers in veterinary medicine and the USPHS. Went over radiology, physical exams, educational requirements, etc.
- North Slope Veterinary Clinic also serves as the regional public health office and the vet is the chief public health officer, so it was great to see that the veterinary clinic does public health activities including water testing, food safety, etc.
- Almost 100% of all households in the area were reached, and almost all dogs and cats not current on annual rabies vaccination were revaccinated.
- USCG provided valuable assistance in setting up the clinic, preparing vaccines, and preparing animals for surgery. 2 villages had not had a veterinarian visit in 1 year and providing vaccinations was a valuable service.
- Poor conditions experienced by some of the animals was hard to see and tried to educate owners about responsible pet ownership, but some owners are extremely resource limited and can only do so much for their pets.
- In the future it would be helpful to clarify expectations with USCG early on so that PHS officers are not expected to perform services like spays in situations where standards of care cannot be met.
- Previous joint mission went to the same area of Alaska, but stayed in Barrow with a well-stocked veterinary clinic and were able to perform higher-level veterinary care. Barrow now has a full-time veterinarian so the need is much higher in the more remote areas.

- Encourage everyone to start thinking about Jr. Vet, Responder, and Vet of the Year awards. Will be sending out information later in the year.

Career Development: CDR Gibbins

- CV summary and CV cover letter formats were sent out to Vet PAC members for comments and approval before posting for the rest of the category.
- CDR Gibbins obtained examples of successful CVs and cover letters from P-PAC who posts de-identified examples.
- Feedback from promotions board has been to keep the CV summary to 1 page. CDR Gibbins will solicit feedback from senior officers who have served on promotion boards to determine if category should go with 1 page vs multiple pages for the CV summary
- Will try to make final decision on the CV summary format in the next couple of weeks so that officers who will be up for promotion can get started.

- Combined SGPAC/CPO/PAC Chairs call
 - CDR Karon Abe will be the new Scientist PAC Chair
 - Presentation was given on the COSTEP program which CDR Gibbins will send out to the listserv
 - Emphasized on the call the importance of bringing issues up through the chain of command. If you are not getting a response, elevate through the chain of command, but should not go outside PHS.
- Congratulations to CAPT Mainzer who was recently awarded the Surgeon General's Exemplary Service medal for his efforts as CPO of the Veterinary PAC.
- Under new accountability structure, RADM Scott Giberson will be assigned as the Director of the Division of CC Personnel and Readiness. Further information about the accountability structure will be forthcoming in the Federal Register.
- Issues surrounding the furlough of PHS officers are still under consideration, with no new information at this time.
- POM for the Global Health Award to recognize international deployments or service has been drafted and sent for review.
- Changes in the retirement system are being discussed in light of the current budget issues and concern reducing retirement pay for officers who serve 20+ years and allowing officers who serve for less than that to be eligible for some retirement pay. Discussion is preliminary at this time and no decisions have been made.
- OCCO Updates:
 - OBC will hold its next graduation this Friday. Thanks to CAPT Terri Clark who will represent the category and welcome our newest officer, LCDR Kerry Pride.
 - OCCO is currently working on the list of officers eligible for promotion for the 2012 cycle.

- Veterinary category had the top readiness percentage among all (~97%) for the first time. Only 1 or 2 veterinary officers did not meet basic readiness.
- Overall, PHS at 93% basic ready
- September readiness check is usually submitted to OMB so officers need to have all their information updated.
- FAD Practitioner Course—Ames, IA
 - Offered by USDA-APHIS-VS twice a year and organized by Dr. John Baer.
 - ~1 week course intended as a refresher for USDA vets who have taken the FAD course at Plum Island.
 - Training for vets to go to farms or operations and take appropriate specimens, how to ship specimens, which labs to send them to, etc.
 - This course does not work with diseased animals like the Plum Island course, but lectures are simulcast between the two.
 - Course is taught by pathologists, parasitologists, FAD specialists, and laboratory specialists. On days 2-5, course is lecture in the am and in pm went to BSL-3 lab to practice restraint and sample collection on chickens, pigs, and sheep before performing necropsies. Last afternoon consisted of a mock exercise.
 - Also received copy of Atlas of Transboundary Animal Diseases
 - No fee associated with the course, so main cost is travel and hotel.
 - Course is good for 36 hours of CE
 - Contact LCDR Sinclair if you are interested in more information.

XI. CPO Comments: CAPT Mainzer

- CDR Gibbins reminded officers that the category is approaching the election season for Vet PAC members. He will check to see how many officers are rotating off and will start the nomination process in September in order to get the nomination and approval package to the SG by December
- Category charter is also due to be updated this year. Have delayed starting on this since the PAC Chairs have been working on a template to use across all categories. The template contains recommendations and options, but changes are not mandatory, including suggested increases in the number of voting members and the length of terms for some categories. If the template has not been adopted within the next month or so, will move forward with updating the Vet PAC charter to meet the deadline.
- A working group to look at the 2013 benchmarks will be convened in the next month or so and will look for volunteers both inside and outside the PAC.
- CAPT Mainzer attended a helpful presentation by Norman Chichester and Mary Boone on Post 9/11 Bill, transferability, and how to apply for benefits. He will scan a hard copy and send out to category. Highlights included:
 - Officers with dependents who are approaching the limits for age to transfer (23 years) will need to work quickly to transfer benefits
 - Officers who had 22 years of service on or before 8/1/2009 don't have any additional service requirements, but won't be able to use/transfer benefits after retirement.
 - For more information, can contact the OCCO help desk (listed in handout)
- Uniform changes may be released soon. Anticipating changes to deployment uniforms with implementation period beginning in January 2012 and full implementation by January 2013. Also will contain information regarding other uniforms and accessories. Specific information cannot be released at this time.
- CPOs and PAC Chairs have been given the opportunity to get feedback from their officers/categories on the draft Strategy Outline for the Surgeon General as America's

Doctor, which is linked to the National Prevention Strategy. Draft will be sent out to the category and will have 2 weeks to make suggestions.

- Pharmacy Category is putting together their own prevention strategy. CAPT Mainzer will send out draft which he would like to use to model what we do as public health veterinarians as well as identify how we can support the National Prevention Strategy in helping to engage both the communities and agencies we serve in implementing this strategy.
- CAPT Mainzer is scheduled to attend the National Association of Local Boards of Health in Coeur d'Alene, ID. He wants to take the opportunity to educate members on the role of public health vets. Vets are playing an important role at the local level and hope that we can do the same at the federal level
- Implementation of a Ready Reserve and equal special pay requests have garnered support from SG and ASH, but don't know where the funds will come from to carry out these changes. CDR Gibbins and several senior officers will also be called upon to help prepare a decision memo the SG and ASH regarding the recent policy to limit T&E for vets. Will request up to 12 years for education credit and 17 years total credit for vets, which is similar to current policy for doctors and dentists. This may lead to a need to limit the permanent grade at which these officers are called to active duty. Will try to have memo out by second week of September.
- CPOs may have opportunity to spend 15-30 minutes of one-on-one time with the ASH for the first time since 2007. This would be a good opportunity to discuss some of these issues and the importance of what we do in our agencies and overall.

- The June 2011 meeting minutes were approved with changes as noted below:
 - Section V – month of AVMA meeting changed from November to July and St. Louis location added
 - Section VI – “Secretary of Defense” added to indicate title of Secretary Gates
 - Sections renumbered from Section VI forward to correct numbering error creating two Section VI entries
 - Motion to approve as amended made by CDR Gibbins and seconded by CAPT Bourke

III. Vet PAC Chair Comments: CDR Gibbins

- Combined SGPAC/CPO/PAC Chairs call
 - Presidential Appointment Efficiency and Streamlining Act of 2011 (S. 679) has passed the Senate and is pending review in the House of Representatives. If passed and signed into law, this bill could hasten calls to active duty by omitting the requirement for Senate confirmation of recommended officers. Potential cons to the bill may include complications for inter-service transfer applicants.
 - GI Bill transferability has been approved and will be made available to PHS officers. Administrative processes are under development to facilitate implementation on August 1. CAC cards and electronic card readers are currently required to gain access to the website to transfer benefits. However, remote access options are under development and pending implementation over the next several months.
 - Health Occupations Students of America (HOSA) representatives attended call and provided a presentation entitled “PHS-HOSA Partnership”. CDR Gibbins distributed a Powerpoint version of the presentation via the listserve. HOSA organization members may seek experiential opportunities (e.g., internships) with the PHS or provide other opportunities for mentorship by PHS officers. Interaction with HOSA and its membership is one of the Surgeon General’s priority issues.
 - HOSA has a veterinary component
 - Composed mostly of high school students
 - Potential recruitment source for motivated veterinary students
 - Working with a local HOSA chapter and students encouraged
 - The 2011 COER is being prepared and will incorporate more space for rater comments. The routing chain for review/approval is also being restructured to streamline the process as well as limit confusion.
 - The details of how potential furloughs to accommodate reactions to budgetary constraints might affect PHS officers are still being discussed.
 - Model PAC charter approved by CPO board and submitted to the OSG for review and approval. This model charter would be recommended but not required for implementation. More discussion and information to follow if approved.
 - This Friday’s (7/22) OBC class graduation represents the first class consisting only of new Calls to Active Duty (CADs). All new CADs will now route through OBC prior to reporting to their duty assignment at their respective agency to facilitate administrative processing, etc.
 - There are currently 750 approved and recommended PHS applicants who have been submitted for senate confirmation. It is unclear how the previous yet-approved bill would impact bringing on these and other CADs.
 - Operation “Lone Star” is proceeding next week, providing medical care to impoverished citizens in select Texas counties.

- One team was deployed to support ND flood response.
- Compensation Branch is anticipating a physical move of their offices in the next 1-2 months. Officers should expect delays in payroll paperwork processing and are advised to submit paperwork as soon as possible to avoid problems.
- A proposal has again been made to establish a unified medical command across DOD healthcare services and is in the news to reduce redundancy and streamline efficiency. Potential impact on PHS is unclear.
- 3 new veterinary EIS officers have commissioned into the PHS; with these additions, the category stands at 88 AD officers.

- Personnel operations memo sent out to new CAD. For new CADs, all categories except medical and dental will have T&E capped at 9 years instead of the current 17 year cap. Will be difficult to bring new officers on board since vets straight out of school have T&E of 8 years without any advanced degrees or training. Unsure how this will affect individuals in the process of applying. CAPT Mainzer and CDR Gibbins are trying to determine where this new rule has come from.
- Suggestion made to look at T&E for last 20 or so incoming veterinary officers to evaluate the number of officers that might be affected.

- Our Subcommittee met early this month to discuss our team's Needs Assessment of the Category; Dr. Langer is leading this effort and the survey is in development to include questions for VetPAC members and the veterinary category at large. Focuses of the survey will include the public Veterinary Category website, the secure Portal, and methods to "push" information to category members such as e-mail listservs and RSS feeds. The survey will be ready for pilot testing soon. We had asked for suggestions or other input as appropriate but haven't yet received any feedback; this offer still stands. Also, we would appreciate the help of a few officers in the Category to help pilot test the survey, if

- On May 9th, we received notice that the HHS Web Communications Division (WCD) was being forced to shut down the HHS Enterprise Portal by July 1, 2011 because WCD lost anticipated funding. However, shortly after this announcement, we were then informed funding would be restored to carry the Portal through the end of the fiscal year. So WCD support for the Portal will continue through the end of FY 2011. As for FY2012, WCD indicated that the Portal will likely be moved to a more solid, sustainable but otherwise undescribed model which might include fee-for-service. At this point, it is unclear where such funding would come from for our Category’s continued presence on the Portal. We will keep the Category advised of future developments.
- Because we were at first thinking we would be forced to make decisions regarding the future of the portal in a relatively short timeframe, I retrieved all documents at currently have them stored locally on my computer. I also looked at Unique Users of the Portal over the last year who logged on more than once. Despite our efforts to promote usage, only 19 officers have logged on more than once in the last year, less than a quarter of the Category. Among those with >1 use, there were a total of 218 hits. Of these, 85% (186) came from Website Subcommittee members (Dwayne Jarmen, John Gibbins, Bryan Buss) or the Executive Secretaries (Christa Hale, Ethel Taylor); only 15% (32) came from others.
- To date, sustained usage of Portal by the Category is limited; we are looking forward to the results of the Needs Assessment which we plan to complete before the end of FY2011 to further inform decisions regarding the Portal, particularly if there will eventually be costs to the Category going forward into FY2012 and beyond.
- CAPT Mainzer added---may want to include log-on instructions in each issue of the CPO minutes/newsletter to increase usage

- Met with CAPT Bailey this morning to discuss 16 billets across 4 categories. Veterinary billets have been sent out and please check for content, accuracy, etc. Need feedback from all Category members by Friday, May 27. Requesting PACs to help prepare these before and provide assistance following the launch. Specific questions can be addressed to CDR Campbell, CDR Gibbins, or CAPT Mainzer. Need more discrimination on research billets for different grades. Applied billets speak most to epidemiology.
- Only one category has completed entire category specific billet review. Only about 1/3 vet category in category specific billets. Taking a hard look at our billets, because hope to have incoming officers and more officers in USDA, DOI, and NOAA. Review will be a 4 step process and hope to complete step 1 (officer review) within 45 days of release. May schedule time with officers to help complete billet and move it along to Step 2 (supervisor).
- If at any point it's determined to not be a category specific billet, then will be moved to the general category billet.
- CPOs and OSG will be able to put admin flags on files if officers don't complete billets in a given period of time. Could potentially weigh in to next promotion cycle.

IX. New Business

X. CPO Comments: CAPT Mainzer

- Interviews have taken place, but SG's decisions for a CPO have not been conveyed at this time.
- Participated in Compensation Advisory Board and presented case for pays consistent with those of Army and Air Force colleagues. Resubmitted white paper documenting roles of PHS vs. civilian colleagues. Special pays awaiting the okay of the Secretary and Associate Secretary of Management.

IV. Vet PAC Chair Comments: CDR Gibbins

- No OBC this month because of pause. Plans are to hold course in May for officers who still need to attend. COA has sent cost analysis to demonstrate that for most officers it is cheaper to go to Anchorage, AK than Cincinnati, OH and is awaiting a response.

II. Special Presentation: CDR Paul Reed, OFRD, Medical Readiness Manager, Global Health Operations

- Current role is expanding global humanitarian assistance, but may change or expand in upcoming OFRD reorganization
- Current scope of GHO activities:
 - For last 5-6 years saw almost logarithmic increase in global assistance/aid
 - FY 2009-2010
 - Funded shipboard missions and medical health and readiness training with DoD
 - Working with Uniformed Services University to develop a graduate global health curriculum using anticipated funds. Hope to roll out curriculum by 2012.
 - With USU developed evaluation program for small-scale humanitarian assistance projects
 - Carried out medical readiness training in Peru to follow-up on USAF mission
 - 2011
 - Will execute Peruvian mission in conjunction with USAF tentatively scheduled for July or August
 - Ongoing participation in Continuing Promise Caribbean and Pacific missions is being reassessed
 - No other international deployments scheduled for this FY year and potentially through the calendar year
 - Will be more engaged in domestic projects targeting underserved populations
- October 2010 Global Health Operations began working on development of an initial global health strategy and is currently in final revisions. Current USPHS missions to date reflect the goals of this strategy and will probably continue to do so
- In light of current budget situation unsure if missions in the future will remain domestically focused or again engage in international projects
- Opportunities for veterinary involvement:
 - International public health engagement should have robust veterinary component since many underserved communities can benefit from veterinary services
 - Current Peruvian mission has veterinarian in planning cell along with members from Applied Public Health Teams 2 and 3. Proposed engagements include veterinary involvement, but final decisions have not been made.
 - Peruvian mission is only operational activity for this year
- Tier 1 and Tier 2 training from OFRD
 - 5 field training exercises and 1 associated with Tier 3 officers.
 - All 5 exercises will offer clinical and non-clinical engagement opportunities, including a veterinary component, and be in a variety of locations

- CDR Reed also currently serves as VetPac/PPAC liaison to OFRD, officers are welcome to reach out to him if needed

Rectangular decals would range from \$0.69 each for 2000 to \$1.99 for ≤ 100 and round decals would range from \$0.69 each for 2500 to \$1.79 each for ≤ 100 . Set up, color match, and art work fees would be approx. \$125. Costs for a 5" round decal would be \$1.24 each for 500 and could be sold for \$8 each so would only need to sell 78 to break even. If each category member purchased one in advance would have funds to do this and selling all 500 could make about \$2,760 for the category fund. If could get in time for COF, hope to sell most if not all of them and avoid shipping fees to purchasers. Currently looking into ways that category members could make tax free donations to our COF fund to be used as "seed money". II. Approve minutes

- The December 2010 meeting minutes will be approved pending CAPT Mainzer's perusal.

III. Vet PAC Chair Comments: CDR Gibbins

- February 16th—joint call with the Physicians PAC. The topic of the call will be physician and veterinary officers' experiences on international and humanitarian deployments. Thanks to those volunteers who will be presenting.
- Pause—highest priority issue is when new officers will be brought on active duty. Deputy Surgeon General is confident this will be announced soon.
- Need DC based officers to help process new officer applications. Will send out more information as it becomes available.
- 10 working groups will be formed to address recommended changes to USPHS. Leadership positions are currently being filled, and an email will be sent out for other volunteers. This is an opportunity to reflect the responsiveness of veterinarians in the ongoing efforts to improve visibility of the federal veterinary workforce across agencies.
- Transferability of GI benefit has been authorized for PHS officers pending approval of the Secretary of Defense. HHS is drafting a memo to explain why this is in the best interests of national security and the recruitment of PHS officers. In order to control costs related to healthcare provisions and long-term health service benefits, DoD and the VA are scrutinizing the transferability component of the education program, so even if we get this benefit it may only be short-term.
- Global awards should be in place in 3-5 months. Nominations will be solicited in late spring-summer and awards will be retroactive to 2005.
- For those submitting paperwork for eOPFs, the backlog had been resolved and there should be a quick turnaround for new submissions.

- Environmental Health Officers are next for the new billet system. Veterinarians are scheduled for March with more information to come.
- OFRD has not provided much information regarding humanitarian missions. Applied public health teams may have more information. Tier 1 and 2 teams most eligible for missions. More to come.
- President's Challenge still valid for meeting basic readiness requirements, however officers are encouraged to use the fitness test instead to avoid difficulties if this option is removed in the future.

IV. Special Presentation: CAPT Tory Hampshire, VMD. Navigating the Waters of Advisory Committee Participation

- CAPT Hampshire discussed how PHS officers can be helpful in serving as experts, witnesses, and/or working group participants to advise agencies and organizations on special matters including drug safety and antibiotic resistance, safety of genetically engineered animals, and food safety.
 - The Federal Advisory Committee Act was developed in the early 1970's to establish councils to advise agencies without potential conflicts of interest.
 - NIH and FDA both have advisory groups intended to be neutral or have no conflicts with any particular agency.
 - Advisory groups announce issues of interest in the federal register for a specified period of time to allow for public participation.
 - If there is a potential conflict of interest, a waiver can potentially be granted by the agency.
 - Questions can be voted on or recommendations can be put in place by the advisory group.
 - Committee meeting results are available on the web.
 - The agency calling for the advisory group has to notify Congress of the topics, costs, and benefits of the advisory group meetings to the taxpayers.
 - These advisory groups provide opportunities for officers to participate or provide their expertise to an agency
- Information on advisory groups, current topics, and required qualifications can be found on the agency website.
- Advisory groups provide a great way to see how decisions are made with regards to controversial public health issues.

The previous ASP .NET web site format used relational positioning which caused the left navigation menu to not appear on some Blackberry devices. The website has been updated and installed and can be found at <http://www.usphs.gov/corpslinks/veterinarian>.

Here is new functionality of the site during 2010:

- An ASP .Net framework is now being employed to separate the display of the site from the main page content of each page; this makes updating site pages much easier
- A form to request access to removal from the Veterinarian listserv has been added to the site
 - Information is copied to the listserv manager for review and determination whether or not the person should be added
 - Users must use the computer that they have at work and have a mail program (e.g., outlook) installed using the email they wish to use.
- A form to request access to the Veterinary Category HHS Portal has been added
 - Access to the portal requires a) a username and password, b) one of the category administrators to add the person to the Veterinary Category Portal
 - If the user indicates that they do not have access to another portal, the email request is sent to the Website Committee and the HHS Portal Engineer for obtaining a username and password then adding to the community.
 - If the user indicates that they have access to another portal community, the email request is only sent the Website committee for adding to the portal
- A form to request password reset for the HHS Portal Added
 - This is sent directly to the portal engineer and the website committee is copied on the request

 - This is a public way to make announcements at the USPHS.gov site pertinent to the Veterinary Category and it's visitors
 - A Excel file was created to create the RSS feed and to generate the email that would be used to post the file on the staging and live server

- We will tentatively schedule the PAC meeting for the third Thursday of each month from 1400 to 1600 EST.

VIII. CPO Comments: CAPT Mainzer

- If you are interested in submitting an abstract to World Congress of Disaster Emergency Medicine (Shanghai, China), the deadline has been extended
- CAPT Mainzer sat in on meeting with Admiral Bailey to represent CPO Board – SG’s outreach meeting for National Prevention Health Promotion in Public Health Council; Notable presentations touched on healthy environment, food safety, and food security, and mental health issues; Council established by Executive Order; 17 members of federal government; By March of 2011, advisory group will develop a report
- CAPT Mainzer will distribute a report from Agency for Healthcare Research and Quality on impact/cost of animal bites in US; over 318,000 emergency department visits related to animal bites; average cost estimated at \$18,000 per encounter; we might serve a role to improve prevention and response to bites
- CAPT Mainzer will also distribute a new publication from the World Bank: People, Pathogens, and our Planet; Volume 1 focuses on One Health perspective. Major publication that will help define some of the problems with which we work as veterinary officers
- CAPT Mainzer participated in working group with colleagues in many areas of disease control and prevention in regards to our health roles and impacts in the new authorization of the farm bill taking place in 2012
- We are still under the hiring pause, but hopefully will get news in near future; issue – many policies that need to be in place before pause can be lifted, but those policies still need approval; issue of appropriations is likely holding up approvals up
- With regards to pay, decisions are still being made whether all officers will receive cost of living increase this next calendar year; assignment incentive program will not be renewed; consolidated pay still waiting for approval of the Secretary
- Last week, CAPT Mainzer chaired a meeting in Washington with veterinarians from other agencies and human resource/administrative specialists who will form the Veterinary Workforce Talent Management Advisory Council (which is part of the Office of Personnel Management); reached consensus among participating agencies to set an agenda of activities for next calendar year to look at what veterinarians do in federal government, what agency and societal missions needs are, and how best we can be responsive to those needs in response to preparedness, food security and safety, regulatory activities, and biomedical research
 - CAPT Mainzer would like to thank CDR Princess Campbell, CAPT Terri Clark, CAPT Elvira Hall-Robinson, and CAPT Estella Jones for their work with this Taskforce
- CAPT Mainzer will be attending winter leadership of AVMA; CAPT Mainzer will ask CDR Gibbins to work on the fact that we are eligible to send junior PHS officer to winter leadership conference so we’ll be able to do that next winter
- Remember that 2011 is World Veterinary Year; PAC might need ad hoc group in Meetings subcommittee to see how we can participate in this ‘celebration’
- There will be an opportunity to comment on the North American Veterinary Education Consortium’s vision and report of recommendation to the veterinary education community. The information will be available on-line and the link will be distributed. LCDR Willy Lanier and CAPT Mainzer have been working to ensure that veterinarians in public service and with One Health focus were included.
- Thank you to Subcommittee Chairs for their service this year
- Thank you to Officers who were deployed in 2010 for representing our profession and category with distinction
- Thanks to CDR Skinner-Harris for involvement with mentoring activities
- Thanks to all those who attended OBC to represent veterinary category

- Thanks to CDR Campbell for working with billet process
- Thanks to LCDR Buss for work with deployment guide which will help those being deployed
- Thanks to CDR Campbell for her service this year, sometimes under short time lines and duress

I. Army Ten-Miler: Dr. Evan Shukan

- Last year, several veterinarians decided to run the Army Ten-Miler as a PHS team. Grew into 50 PHS runners on 9 teams, and representing most organizations, including the Deputy Surgeon General.
- Also recruited volunteers to man a booth at the Army Ten-Miler Expo, cheerers stationed at various points along the course on the day of the race, and worked with Souls for Soles to collect running shoes to distribute to people around the world.
- Several articles, including in upcoming Dec and Jan issues of COA Frontline, have been written about the experience. LCDR Lanier suggested having a JOAG participant from last year also submit an article for JOAG Journal.
- Goal for 2011 Army Ten-Miler is 150 runners for PHS teams. Anyone interested in being involved as a runner or a volunteer can contact Dr. Shukan.
- Suggestions to increase visibility of PHS include sponsoring a similar team for Atlanta based officers for the Peachtree 10K, and for PHS members to wear PHS gear when working out.
- CAPT Mainzer requested members think about other charitable activities or functions that USPHS could start in order to increase visibility, and positively impact public health.

II. Guest Speaker: Dr. Carney Jackson

- Dr. Jackson spent 11 months in Afghanistan on a National Guard Agriculture Development Team creating sustainable veterinary and agricultural resources locally, by teaching local vets and students how to use the resources available to them instead of relying on outside sources. Move more towards privatization instead of reliance on government or other countries.
- Activities included working with partners to address procurement issues and nutrition concerns and developing training for local veterinarians and veterinary students, and providing veterinary care for more than 1,000 animals in a region lacking veterinary services.
- Worked with several veterinary schools in Afghanistan and provided training courses for veterinarians and students in several regions, demonstrating physical examinations, necropsy procedures, and microbiology techniques. Veterinary students are very knowledgeable, but lack many hands-on opportunities.
- Barriers to adequate veterinary care include transportation of animals is not possible in some areas, therefore encouraged vets to get motorcycles so they could take veterinary care into the field.
- Thanks for taking time to discuss such an interesting program.

III. PAC Chair Comments: CDR Campbell / CDR Gibbins

- Officers should ensure that their new COER accurately reflects their performance, without the inflation of scores observed with the old COER.
- MAB has completed updating all vaccinations through October, but is still working on vaccinations from November. This will not hurt those who are up for promotion, unless there is a history of multiple late or absent vaccinations.

 - mission will be conducted off of the USNS Comfort and is medically focused with primary and surgical care; no evidence to date from US Navy planners of broader public health mission; main planning conference in Dec10 may elucidate otherwise
- Peru MEDRETE –
 - riverine medical readiness training exercise to Alto Amazonas, Peru
 - follow-on mission to USPHS mission in April 2010
 - APHT 2 and APHT 3 have been tasked to conduct international field training and are developing concept of operations for this mission

- initial CONOPs – deploy an expeditionary element of USPHS APHTs in collaboration with USAF and Peruvian Navy personnel to conduct public health activities to remote underserved communities in the upper Amazon jungle of Peru

- CAPT Bloland's background: Currently he is Associate Director for Science in the Center for Global Health, CDC. He started at CDC as an EIS officer in malaria branch, and worked in malaria for 17 years. Of the many projects he headed, he specialized in acute pediatric malaria, worked with WHO to assess clinical efficacy of antimalaria drugs, developed strategy for malaria in refugee populations, and regional malaria elimination work in UAE. Now he is working with FAO & FETP to create opportunities for overseas vets in epidemiology & outbreak response.
- Veterinarians are becoming more widely recognized as important players in public health, mostly thanks to H5N1 influenza. CGH working to engage ministries of agriculture in programs that address zoonotic diseases. There are still many differences in training of veterinarians—need for education of professionals and adding training to veterinary school curriculum. Also work is needed make foreign ministries of health aware of need for veterinary involvement.

Scholarships are available through the Army for travel and lodging.
- NOAA Advisory panel—veterinarians in NOAA interested in expanding MOU placing veterinarians on ships as medical officers or public health officers. Also interest in establishing a residency training program in marine ecology and health.
- Federal Veterinary Workforce Talent Management and Advisory Council—developing a list of tasks for veterinarians. Discussing establishing a series for veterinarians that would require maintenance of a veterinary license, as opposed to the 701 series where licensure is not required.
- Several officers who were brought from reserve to active duty after March 23 were not listed as eligible for promotion. Working to resolve this issue and urging those who may be eligible should continue preparing their promotion materials.
- CPOs will be meeting with new deputy surgeon general next week to plan next year's strategy.
- A new International Food Protection Training Institute, funded by the Kellogg Foundation, is being established with emphasis on food protection and public health.

II. Promotion Overview / Q&A: CDR Angela Mtungwa

- CDR Mtungwa is a Promotion Coordinator/OCCO
- Speaker recommends that you refer to the Promotion information on the CCMIS website, rather than her talk as the promotion website will have the most up-to-date information
- Permanent Promotion cycle 2010 is on hold because of the healthcare reform bill; as a result the 2011 cycle will be delayed
- If you were up for permanent promotion in 2010 cycle, you might have to be re-reviewed by 2011 board, so you need to have your file up-to-date
- Q&A:
 - Q: How do awards count? Do they get awarded a certain number of points? A: Each promotion board does it differently, with the help of a half day of guidance from OCCO and discussion with the CPO. They generally make sure that you have the level of award that is appropriate for your rank. Same with letters of appreciation. Files pop up randomly so that you aren't viewed by each person at the same time (so you aren't the last or the first file viewed by all board members).
 - Q: Are there instructions for the continuing education summary sheet? How many years to go back? What conferences are appropriate for listing? A: Look at your category benchmarks. Include relevant conferences that don't necessarily give you CE units. Include CE summary units for each activity.
 - Q: Does taking a year off for long term training affect your time in service? A: The respondent was unsure, as it might affect your time in service on your current tour IF you are actually taking a year off. Agency supported long term training should not have the same effect.
 - Q: You spoke of the promotion cycle running from July 2, 2011 to June 1, 2012. What if you call to duty date was June 2 to June 30th? A: If your eligibility falls into June 2-30, 2012 your effective date would July 1, 2012. Because it is the first date of the month following your eligibility. Thus you would not be eligible for promotion until the next cycle.
 - Q: There are separate rank orders for each board. Are the two boards for nursing or physicians combined? A: No, there are upper boards for O-6 and lower boards for O-5.
 - Q: What is promotion credit? A: This was only for Regular Corps, so that will change in light of us all becoming Regular Corps.

III. Open Discussion of Retirement Issues: CAPT Charles Rabkin

- Changes in PHS policy regarding retirement pay for persons with greater than 25 years service – once past 25 years you get no additional percentage of your base pay for additional service; so there is no 'incentive' to stay on past 25 years
- A clear, fair policy might have an effect on retention past 25 years

- We are the only service that pays additional for the years 20 to 25 years. Concerns that bringing this issue up could lead to the 5 years we get being removed were raised (and have been raised in this conversation among other groups as well).
- Several comments were made indicating that the retirement process is very difficult – it is even difficult to figure out how much money you will make at retirement. Commenters would like the system to be more transparent and simple.

II. Recruitment Effort

- The Recruitment/Retention Subcommittee is working on a fact sheet to be distributed at recruiting events. This fact sheet will include a compensation comparison
- It often comes up at recruiting events that the Commissioned Corps does not have a mechanism for placing people in jobs like other services do. (For instance, you sign up for the Army, get accepted, and they place you in a position; in the Commissioned Corps, you must find your own position). This is seen as a negative for some potential recruits.
 - We can put a positive spin on that...you are able to find the job that fits you best.
 - In addition, we do not currently involuntarily deploy into war zones and we are not relocated against our will
 - Keep in mind that officers serve as the face of the Corps in their area
 - If there are recruiting opportunities in your area, be sure to let the Recruitment/Retention subcommittee know about them
 - CDR Gibbins was informed by the AVMA representative that works on career services that they get questions regarding finding federal jobs. We could put some information there. CDR Gibbins shared the representatives information with LCDR Davidson (Recruitment/Retention Chair)

III. Deployments

- This deployment series has not gone as well as hoped; deployment was today and the officers being deployed were still without some information and supplies

- We are having a chronic problem with OFRD; they are supposed to have equipment for restraint and vaccine administration, but they have not been providing it.
- The concern is that we had 1 year to plan for this deployment, so why were we not prepared? Is this a communication issue between PHS OFRD and the Coast Guard?
- One issue raised is that the PAC has never been on the pre-planning team
- Currently, financing of these 'extra' supplies is coming out of the officer's pocket, so can we use PHS monies to start a cache of these items; put together 3-5 kits with the basics to be sent to the officers before deployment

Issues raised

- Where the kits will be housed when not on deployment? Who will maintain the kits?
- Might make most sense to keep it with the persons who do clinical work (such as those working in lab animal sciences)
- Will we have large and small animal specific kits?

How will we pay for this?

- We can raise funds specifically for this purpose.
- As federal officers, we have to be careful about corporate donations.

- Looking for standard operating procedures for the committee and plan for coverage of Officer Basic Course

V. CPO Comments

- As a Corps, we are still on a hiring pause, but we need to continue to recruit

II. Approve Minutes

- The May 2010 meeting minutes were approved as written. (Motion made by CAPT Altekruse and seconded by CDR Gibbins)
- The June 2010 minutes from joint PPAC/VetPAC meeting were approved as written. (Motion made by CDR Gibbins and seconded by CDR Guerra)
- The June 2010 Voting Members meeting minutes were approved as written. (Motion made by CDR Campbell and seconded by CDR Gibbins)

III. Presentation on the Inactive Reserve Corps: LCDR Rebecca Bunnell (Office of Reserve Affairs); “Inactive Reserve Corps, the Impact of the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act (ACA), and the Ready Reserve”

- There was a fairly robust Inactive Reserve Corps (IRC) until ACA was passed in March 2010
- IRC officers were
 - CC Officers who had separated from the Corps; kept information and readiness status up to date, but were no longer active; or
 - COSTEP that were waiting to finish their qualifying degree; or
 - Officers directly commissioned into the IRC
- IRC was a section of the Reserve Corps used to backfill positions during extended sick leaves or annual leaves, to respond in disasters and emergency situations, to serve as subject matter experts, and to provide trainings
- ACA eliminated cap on Regular Corps, dissolved Reserve Corps (automatically rolling all active duty Reserve Corps officers into the Regular Corps) and established a Ready Reserve Corps
- Since there is no Reserve Corps, there is no IRC
- Ready Reserve Corps
 - Written to be similar to Reserve Corps in other uniformed services
 - Will likely participate in Officer Basic Course and routine trainings
 - Call to Duty likely involuntary and might include foreign deployment

Q & A

- **Q:** CAPT Clemmons, who was an active member of the IRC, raised concerns about the age limit for the Ready Reserve Corps and whether former IRC officers would come into the Ready Reserve as their permanent rank versus their temporary rank. **A:** This is being actively worked on at the moment. At this point age is not an issue, but since this will be a new appointment, permanent versus temporary rank might be an issue. With regards to age, the medical standards have changed so new appointments would need to meet medical standards for appointment. CAPT Mainzer interjected that new generalized and category-specific appointment standards are being developed.
- **Q:** Megin Nichols, who was recently terminated because she no longer had the option to become inactive, wanted to know if those recently terminated could automatically be appointed to the Ready Reserve. **A:** This is still being negotiated, but it will likely be a separate appointment since it is a different corps (IRC via Reserve Corps versus the Ready Reserve Corps). CAPT Mainzer asked that the PAC be given a list of action items that recently terminated Reserve Corps and IRC can do to help them get back on board.
- **Q:** CDR John Gibbins inquired about whether any thought had been given to an individual Ready Reserve that serves over an 8 year period similar to the Reserves in the Department of Defense. **A:** The hope is that the USPHS Ready Reserve will have similar components.

- **Q:** LCDR Bryan Buss asked whether it is the ultimate goal to move all deployment activities to the Ready Reserve. **A:** This has not been discussed, but she does not believe that is the intention.
- CAPT Romano will be distributing this information in the next few days.

III. VetPAC Chair Comments: CDR Campbell

- Our Surgeon General has made two visits to sites affected by the Gulf oil spill
- It looks like the lift in the hiring 'pause' might come soon as they are close to wrapping up the review of Corps transformation
 - 271 of the ~450 applicants in 'pause' have been commissioned
- Medical Affairs Branch will complete immunization documentation by 09/31/2010 so that effect on readiness will be resolved
- We have been asked to provide a contact person for Officer Basic Course; most PACs are using their Career Development Chair. We need a volunteer.
- The Uniform Advisory Committee is reforming. We need Chief Professional Officer recommendations for our PAC's representation. CDR Campbell is interested. CAPT Mainzer indicated that he also has another interested party from whom he has received a note of intent. CAPT Mainzer needs a letter of intent from those who are interested, which he will then forward on to the nominations committee. There is no limit on the number of committee members.
- If you are deploying, please be sure to keep an eye on emails sent out from OFRD regarding what you need for deployment (uniforms, dog tags, paying for meals and getting reimbursed)
- Note to the mentoring subcommittee: These subcommittees are being evaluated, so we need to be ready and make sure that the business practices of the committee are in shape.

IV. Subcommittee Updates

Career Development: CAPT Altekruise

- Initial meeting for this subcommittee was supposed to occur earlier in the year, but chair is not receiving replies from those who initially indicated they were interested
- CAPT Altekruise would like some input from the PAC as to his next steps
- It was recommended that CAPT Altekruise draft an email looking for volunteers and then send it to the Executive Secretary for distribution on the list serve.

- Inviting the incoming EIS officers in the veterinary category was raised. All three officers are state-based and will not be in town for AVMA. Having a brief ceremony for them while they are in town was raised. The Executive Secretary will provide names and contact information.
- CAPT Mainzer informed the Meetings Subcommittee that our PAC is the lead planner for the Tri-Services Holiday Ball. Tentative date is December 11th. Meetings subcommittee needs to find a location (it has been requested that the location not be Ft. Myer again). Contact CAPT Terri Clark, as CAPT Clark is familiar with the process.
 - Will need to find venue, implement ticketing system

II. The 2010 COER: CAPT Benally and CAPT Plasencia (OCCFM)

- Today, we will cover some of the changes to the COER

- Instead of A-E/F, it is now 1-7 with guidance for what the scales mean
- Attachment 2 is a comment box for the rater
- The reviewing official now has the opportunity to review COER before it is released to the officer
- There is a new section for areas of improvement to encourage a dialogue between officer and rater.
- Launching system on October 6, 2010
- Brief summary of comparative analysis
 - To determine if rating using old COER would be the same if using the new COER
 - Results: The ratings are less homogenous and are not comparable to previous COERS.
- Q: Given that study seems to show rater variability, will there be some way to standardize the results? A: Not at this point
- Q: Given that instrument is so different, was that the intent and is the new tool valid? A: The process in developing the tool has taken 3 years with input of many people from all categories. One of the issues was what we were rating. Decision to only include the 8 factors on the new COER reflects that input.
- Q: Was any analysis done to see if there are differences across agencies? A: Sample size was too small for that analysis.
- Q: Are there thoughts to define the ranks in the scale that are not defined (other than 2, 4, and 6) as you are not defining the middle or extremes? A: No, it was done this way because of the input we received.
- Q: Some of the questions would be difficult to answer for people who are primarily clinical (for example, group projects). How fair will it be in judging different job requirements? A: The answerer claims that he did a lot of work in groups and in the community when he was a practitioner. So perhaps we should be grooming clinicians to work more closely in the community.

Q: Echoes previous question: if a full time job that is centered in clinical work, how can we ensure that the rater is rating people correctly if the public health aspect is not part of their job description? A: This speaks to training of the rater. This instrument is for a wide variety of positions throughout the world. The rater may need to adjust some of rating scores based on setting and available opportunities.
- Q: For rater instructions, are comments required on everything? A: Comments are only required from the rater at the end of the scores; there is a limited amount of space, so hopefully the rater will not just reiterate officer's statement. The rater should either contest what officer stated or give additional supporting evidence.
- Q: In looking at scores and descriptions, things in the 1-2 level seem like where an entry level officer would score. So should you think of them as scoring higher than a typical junior officer? Or should junior officers score less? A: Instrument should be grading to see if they are at grade level. But that is just his opinion...he would prefer to use it in officer development than for promotion purposes. However, COER designed to give the score that the officer's behavior expects. So it is likely that junior officers will score lower than senior officers.

Questioner suggests this be used just for development, not promotion since such a large part of the promotion board decisions relies on COER.

The respondent said that promotion boards focus more on the narrative and should not focus on scores at this point since we aren't sure what these numbers mean.
- Q: Can we have more information on training of rater? A: We will develop educational materials designed for on-line access for raters.

- Q: Why are 2, 4, and 6 anchored (psychologists anchor extremes and middle)? How does this bias ratings? A: Speaker unable to really address this question, but he would be surprised if people receive 7s.
Q: It seems like we need to give description for all or anchor extremes and middle.
A: We will keep this in mind as it is evaluated.
- Q: Were there any differences between Corps and non-Corps raters? A: No difference.
- Q: With instructions to rater, will there be guidelines as to how they should be rating officers (how many should be getting each ranking)? Can you only have a certain percent get a certain score? A: This is the forced distribution. USPHS did not want to use this; we felt the officers should be ranked based on their accomplishments, not based on a predetermined number.

III. OFRD Requirements: CDR Paul Reed

- CDR Reed serves as liaison for PPAC and VetPAC to OFRD
- Training – rolling out field training exercises in domestic locations
- Readiness and Domestic Response Activities
 - Still rostering for Pacific Crossroads response though veterinary component is fulfilled
 - Gulf response is still active/evolving - No requirements for veterinarians
 - 52 positions to be filled for ASPR-related activities for event on National Mall for July 4
 - Pacific Partnership – second team rotates in next week in Singapore- Still need some physician participation, but veterinary needs fulfilled
 - Need 2 vets per team for each mission in the Central / South America trip
 - Need health educators for a non-clinical setting
 - Number of missions planned with inter-agency partners, but all are backburnered; awaiting decisions in HHS to use funds in international settings
- Q: How large scale do you think oil spill call ups will be? A: Difficult to guess as requests are not specific; will increase and will likely cross cutting, but cannot guess a number
- Q: Can we deploy without official orders? A: Not as a PHS officer, related to liability for practice; could go as NGO participant without orders
- Q: My agency does not want to pay me while I'm on a mission. So I cannot go? What can I do? A: We need to explore alternative funding issues.
- Q: We heard that the President's Challenge will be disappearing in the next three years? Is that correct? A: That is similar to what he has heard.
- Q: Will there be other options for fitness test for people who cannot do APFT test? A: They will likely need a waiver, perhaps a partial waiver. But this policy has not been defined. But might be aligned with other uniformed services.
- Q: Can I email OFRD to get them to stop sending the non-compliant to readiness email if it is regarding vaccination? A: Wait and hold it until next week; individual officers will not be held accountable as they usually would for other non-MAB related non-compliance at this time.

- Purpose of this meeting is to find out what the subcommittees are currently working on and what additional support they need from the CPO, Chair, and PAC

III. Subcommittee updates

Readiness

- Inactive Reserve Corps (IRC)
 - Receiving a lot of calls regarding the IRC in light of changes laid out in the Affordable Care Act (essentially the IRC has been dissolved and will be replaced with a Ready Reserve [RR], though the logistics and operations of the RR have not been determined)
 - IRC Officers want to know if it will be possible for them to participate in the ship-based missions; this is important as little interest/availability has been expressed by active officers

II. Discussion of Mental Health and Quality of Life Survey to be Distributed to PPAC: CAPT Marc Safran

- To review factors that might affect mental health and camaraderie of PHS physicians
- Will be accomplished through a 10 minute survey
- Also a quality of life survey that have been asked to member of other uniformed services and healthcare providers in other settings
- Will make it as confidential as possible. Therefore some OPDIVs will be grouped together. For instance, BOP only has a few officers, so they will not be able to be examined separately
- What prompted this study? 1. Concerns expressed about morale, losing medical officers 2. Issue of Fort Hood shooting prompted other uniformed services to use the quality of life survey
- Promote a culture where we take better care of ourselves and each other
- Welcome suggestions
- Question...could we do this with VetPAC? Perhaps, do not want to combine info so they can tease out PPAC. But perhaps they can work it out with VetPAC. CDR Campbell will be provided with CAPT Safran's contact information.

III. Discussion of Officer Profile System: LCDR Martha Wanca

- OPS — Collection tool for individuals to put in their accomplishments. These get validated and sent over to Direct Access.
- Do not enter qualifying degree, license renewal (for example, veterinarians do not need to enter their veterinary degree or license, but would need to enter additional degrees [like MPH] or certifications [such as ACVPM]).
- Purpose — searchable database to match officer attributes to Corps opportunities
- Currently there are picture files in eOPF (such as .tif files)...these files are not accessible through Direct Access and are not searchable
- OPS info will be entered into Direct Access, but first must be primary source validated...officer registers accomplishment, have college send transcript (or other awarding organization)
- Plans for the future — a matching system so that officer looking for a new job can check a box so that agencies can view their info...agencies can match them with a billet/position requirements/preferences
- At this time, collecting degrees beyond qualifying degree, registrations, certifications, additional licensures beyond those tracked to maintain commission
- Instructions on how to register documents: Need to set up profile first. Then have the documents send in for validation. [Note: Directions are attached to end of these minutes]
- Different ways to submit primary source

- Have transcript sent from university, not diploma or degree. Mailed copy from officer not acceptable unless unsealed envelope
 - Certifying bodies can send a letter.
 - Right now, transformation officer can verify certification on the internet if the officer sends the correct url
- Just because something is in eOPF, you still need to validate. B/c documents are faxed in by officer. Not necessarily official...not primary source validated.
- Use of OPS is voluntary
- If you got board certified after commission and receive special pay, do you have to enter this info into the OP?
 - It is not required, will not affect special pays. But need to send it in for use in this matching process.
- If held degree not required for commissioning, for instance, MPH, do they have to enter it?
 - Yes, if they want that available for the matching system. But the entire system is voluntary
- Officer is responsible for cost of forwarding transcripts
- Will this become mandated?
 - Has been considered, but not decided at this point.
- How is this going to reduce duplication with the service provided by USA Jobs.gov? Will agency be able to pull documents from system or will they sign off that the documents are verified...talking about giving the employer access. Direct Access for Corps only, not all USA jobs are for CC officers.
- Suggestion: Link to resume to connect to USA Jobs...connect USA jobs and Direct Access. Indicated that this is not likely to happen because Direct Access contains confidential info.
- Comment: USA jobs should non-competitively forward CC officers, but this is not consistent.
- Information on OPS will be available only if officer wants to make it available. If not job hunting, will not be in the search.

- **How to Register Accomplishments in the Officer Profile System**

How to register degrees, certifications, and licenses that are beyond qualifying credentials:

1. Click on <https://dcp.psc.gov/cclogin/ccmislogin.aspx> and log in or go to the DCP website and log into the secure pages of CCMIS.
2. After you log on to the CCMIS, go to Activity Menu on left hand side and under “Officer” click on “Profiles Data Entry.”
3. You can register two basic types of documents: Training and Licensure/Certification. Click the “Add” button under the appropriate document type.
4. Complete all the information requested then click the “Submit” button.
5. Your information will appear on the screen under the appropriate document type.
6. Continue to add additional documents or log out of the system.

II. Approve Minutes

- The October 2009 meeting minutes were approved. (Motion made by CDR Gibbins and seconded by LCDR Wilson.)
- The December 2009 meeting minutes were approved. (Motion made by Dr. Clemmons and seconded by CDR Gibbins.)
- One correction to the January 2010 meeting minutes was requested – the removal of Dr. Adam Langer as presenter at the 2010 CDC Veterinary Day. These minutes were approved as amended. (Motion made by Dr. Clemmons and seconded by Dr. Langer.)

III. PAC Chair Comments: CDR Campbell

- The new billets will roll out in March 2010 for the standard billets. They are currently being beta tested by OCCO and OCCFM.
- The next readiness run will be March 31, 2010. Go to Direct Access and check your readiness status...Don't wait for a call or email from the PAC telling you that you are not currently basic ready!
- We need to maintain a health lifestyle, not just for the readiness numbers but so that we can fully enjoy our lives while we are here.
- Currently, immunizations are self-reported in the OFRD website along with faxing proof of immunization to the Medical Affairs Branch (MAB). After June 1, 2010, MAB will enter immunization data. Thus, you MUST submit hard copies of proof of immunizations to MAB.
 - The question was raised whether MAB would be ready for this. CDR Campbell indicated that MAB leadership says they are ready to enter this data in a timely manner.
 - The question was raised whether this also pertains to inactive Reserve members. CDR Campbell will look into this.
- There was a discussion centered on emails informing officers that they must send in hard copies of all degrees and certifications beyond your veterinary degree. The concern was whether or not this was required or optional. Per CDR Wright, the Direct Access personnel who attended the December 2009 indicated that this practice is optional at this time and it primarily used for job searches.
- International training: The mission of the Continuing Promise might be affected by recent events in Haiti. The Pacific Partnership missions will continue as planned.
- Domestic training:
 - RDF-3 will train in TN, March 16-19, 2010. This has been described as 'didactic domestic training.'
 - Additional 2010 trainings focused on community outreach will take place in Kentucky, West Virginia, and Maryland.

IV. CPO Comments: CAPT Mainzer

- Surgeon General's 8 Strategic Initiative & 5 Priorities will be released shortly to shore up Healthy People 2020
 - One Health practice and food security mentioned as increased priorities
 - Focus on biomedical research and basic science being stressed
- Family Health History Toolkit – developed with the support of Microsoft Corporation. Use it and promote it professionally and personally. <https://familyhistory.hhs.gov/fhh-web/home.action>
- It is promotion season! The promotion board will meet from now until the end of April. 2,644 Corps members (all categories) are eligible for temporary and permanent promotion. Success rates are not yet figured out because of policy issues that are pending including the new approved ceiling for the Regular Corps, readiness directives, veterinary category appointment standards and consolidated pay.
- March 31st is the last day to correct self-reported immunizations for readiness. After that, proof of immunizations must be on file with MAB and MAB will enter all information. During the transition period (March 31 to June 1), you can compare what MAB has entered with your self-reports in the OFRD website. Keeping MAB up-to-date might be more challenging for people who do not use a central occupational health clinic for immunizations.
- Exact date of roll out of category-specific billets is unknown. May or may not be June for our category.
- New COER is being pilot tested for use in the next review cycle.
- CAPT Mainzer was asked to participate in Office of Personnel Management-led talent management advisory council being chartered across the federal government to look at the veterinary work force in the federal government. This task force is reaching out to all agencies and looking across all agencies.
 - They will look at what veterinarians do in the federal government and the needs of people and agencies we serve
 - Will also include human resources and administrative positions
 - This will add to the strategic planning for the federal veterinary workforce
 - They are also working with American Association of Veterinary Medical Colleges to look forward at societal needs for training future veterinarians.
- We missed the opportunity for this year, but will look into accession bonuses for fiscal year 2011. We may be able to offer 1 or 2 accession bonuses in the form of loan repayment program for new officers who are willing to fill areas of critical need in state, local, or rural communities.
- USDA Accreditation process changed as of December 2009. This is likely an important skill set for emergency response. By July, you must let the USDA know your status (Lapsed, Category 1, or Category 2).

II. CPO Comments: CAPT Mainzer

- Congratulations to CDR Princess Campbell, the new PAC Chair.
- Thank you to CDR Jennifer Wright, our Ex-officio, for her service to the Corps, the category, and the profession.
- Also, congratulations to LCDR Dwayne Jarman who recently welcomed a new son into the world. LCDR Jarman was generous enough to share a picture with us.

- Please feel free to share your good news with the PAC.
- CAPT Mainzer commended CDRs Wright and McQuiston, LCDR Bair-Brake, and Dr. Nina Marano for an excellent Veterinary Student Day at CDC.
 - This event is an excellent way to show veterinary students and faculty what public health veterinarians and veterinarians at CDC do.
 - Approximately 400 students and faculty attended.
 - Presentations were given by CDR Funk, LCDRs Bryant and Skinner-Harris, Dr. Langer, LT Wilder-Kofie.
- CAPT Mainzer's main priorities for the category are the 3 Rs: Retention of officers (focusing on pay and benefits), Recruitment (and increased ability to work in new areas), and Response (improving our category's ability to respond to emergency and public health needs).
- At the recent CPO Board meeting, there was discussion of special pays for retention. CAPT Mainzer is hoping the Secretary will sign off on providing for the Commissioned Corps what the uniformed services under DoD earn.
- Also, hoping that the Secretary under the legislative arm will correct transferability of the GI Bill for Commissioned Corps officers, in order for CC officers to use the benefits for dependents.
- CAPT Mainzer is working closely with Senior USDA staff to look at organizing the needs for veterinarians in the federal work force, which will be incorporated into an OPM report to the Senate.
- We are getting closer to our goal of the expanded MOU with USDA, which would open up further career opportunities for USPHS officers (including many different categories) in USDA divisions outside of FSIS. CAPT Mainzer hopes to have this completed in the next few months.
- Haiti Response:
 - US response efforts are being spearheaded by USAID.
 - Moving into the recovery and reconstruction phase of the response for which USPHS officers will surely be needed.
 - Several different agencies are collaborating to look at the recovery effort and rebuilding Haiti.
 - There might be changes in the missions for the 2010 Pacific Promise mission.
 - There might be more training opportunities including those for veterinary clinical skills.

- OFRD and NGOs might need to work together to provide a coordinated clinical outreach effort with human and animal health issues addressed simultaneously.
- CAPT Mainzer and several other PHS officers will be meeting with the Association of American Veterinary Medical Colleges (AAVMC) and the North American Veterinary Medical Educational Consortium (NAVMEC) to discuss competencies and proficiencies that are needed in veterinary education to shape the future federal work force.

 - The final decision might depend on the number of USPHS veterinarians that would be present at each meeting.

- CAPT Mainzer suggested that we could also swear in or introduce the incoming Epidemic Intelligence Service Officers (EISOs) who choose the Commissioned Corps.

Recruitment/Retention: CAPT Thomas

- CAPT Thomas was recently at OCCO and learned that 5 veterinary applicants to the Commissioned Corps have been approved by the current Appointment Board. Three more, likely incoming EISOs, will be up for approval at the next Appointment Board.
- Additionally, there are 21 CO-STEPS applicants.
 - There might be opportunities for these CO-STEPS at USDA. However, many CO-STEPS want to work at CDC. Thus, we should work to encourage the CO-STEPS to take what is offered as all are good opportunities to learn more about the veterinarian's role in public health.
 - LCDR Jarman inquired whether administrative opportunities would be appropriate for CO-STEPS. The consensus was that an administrative position might be a good way to get them in the door, after which efforts could be made to find them a more scientific appointment.
 - CAPT Ross discussed that she came into the Corps as a CO-STEP and found it invaluable. However, she has had trouble convincing the chain of command in her division that it is a worthwhile program. CAPT Mainzer offered to discuss CO-STEP with supervisors.
 - LDCR Wilson suggested having liaisons give presentations to supervisors at their agencies. CDR Campbell suggested that anyone could do this, not just liaisons.
 - CAPT Spires inquired whether hiring freezes would impact CO-STEPS. CAPT Jones from OCFM indicated that the hiring freeze should not effect anything until the next fiscal year.

- Remember that you can find any Commissioned Corps policies at the Electronic Commissioned Corps Issuance System (eCCIS) (<http://dcp.psc.gov/eccis/>).
- It appears that the Force Management Directive, which is determined by permanent grade, will remain at 4000. Thus, it might have some effect on assimilation.
- They are still working on special pays, especially for areas of shortage (such as veterinarians). The directive is before the Secretary, but OCFM has received no explanation as to why it has not moved forward.
- Remember that the Assistant Secretary for Health (ASH) terminated Assignment Incentive Pay; it ends December 2010.

- Additionally, it is unclear what the method for accepting these documents is. Does it need to be accepted by the CPO, voted on the VetPAC voting membership, or voted on by the entire PAC? CDR Campbell will look into the procedure.
