

Job Title:

Army: Clinical Psychologist - 1st SFG, Joint Base Lewis McCord, WA (O-5 billet, Supervisory)

Job Description:

The primary responsibility of this position is to provide technical expertise, guidance, and direct services in the area of clinical psychology to members of the 1st Special Forces Group (Airborne). In concert with the Group, develops, plans, initiates, and delivers programs for both treating behavioral health issues and promoting optimal performance for unit Soldiers and their family members. Given the unique characteristics of the organization and its members, this duty requires significant autonomy and the ability to operate with minimal guidelines and maximum originality. Assumes responsibility for management of referrals and disposition of referrals for behavioral health care. Provides professional development and awareness education to leadership and Soldiers as requested. Functions as liaison between the unit and other behavioral health assets at the local MTF and the community. Provides a full spectrum of direct professional services to include psychological assessment across the range of Army administrative evaluations (e.g., sniper, recruiter, etc.), aviation psychology evaluations, and the implementation and oversight of US Army medical standards, policies, and practices. Also provides individual, marital, family, and group treatment to unit Soldiers and their families. Supervises additional behavioral health assets who are assigned to support 1st Special Forces Group (Airborne). Performs other duties as assigned.

At least 51% of the incumbent's time will be spent on direct mental health patient care and/or mental health clinical management.

Requirements:

License: A current, unrestricted, and valid license as a clinical psychologist from a U.S. State, District of Columbia, Commonwealth, Territory, or other jurisdiction is required.

Training: The candidate must possess a qualifying doctoral degree in clinical psychology from an American Psychological Association (APA) accredited university or professional psychology program. Shall have completed an APA accredited internship/residency in clinical psychology.

Additional Requirements:

Must hold a Secret or higher security clearance. Must be willing to undergo pre-assignment screening and interview. In addition to routine clinical mental health care, must be able and willing to interact with Soldiers and leadership outside of the office, within the workplace.

PHS officers assigned under this Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) must remain available for PHS deployments. Under this MOA, PHS officers are not authorized to deploy with the military.

Minimum 3 year commitment.
