JTF CapMed: Director (Psychiatrist)-Complementary and Integrative Medicine, Fort Belvoir Community Hospital, Fort Belvoir, VA (O-6 billet, Supervisory)

Job Description:

Serves as a board certified physician, who has psychiatry privileges and will report to the Medical Director for the Addictions Treatment Services (Chair, Department of Addiction Medicine) at Fort Belvoir Community Hospital (FBCH), Fort Belvoir, VA. The incumbent has the major responsibility for planning, organizing, directing, and supervising the delivery of complementary and integrative treatment services in a continuum of care that includes ambulatory care, hospital consultation care, intensive outpatient program care (ASAP), a partial outpatient co-occurring services and a residential treatment program. The general program direction is coordinated with Fort Belvoir's clinical chain of command. In addition, to ensure a full continuum of behavioral health care for the beneficiaries, the incumbent will coordinate activities with the Department of Psychiatry's Partial Hospital Program at Walter Reed National Military Medical Center (WRNMMC) in Bethesda, MD; Outpatient Addictions Treatment Services at WRNMMC; and with Fort Belvoir's Army Substance Abuse Program (ASAP). The incumbent independently plans and carries out assigned duties in accordance with the generally accepted standards of care in addictions medicine, family medicine, complementary and integrative medicine, and professional practice standards. The incumbent has complete professional responsibility for all medical aspects of the addictions treatment services. Evaluation of performance is based on the exercise of sound leadership, timely implementation of programmatic goals, personnel management practices, and quality medical care. The incumbent monitors treatment services through performance improvement practices designed to identify problem issues and develop appropriate responses. The incumbent will develop, as required, reports related to program operations. The incumbent's work will conform to the U.S. Army, Joint Commission, and Medical Command Standards, as well as to the ethical principles of the American Osteopathic Association or the American Medical Association, the standards of practice for addiction medicine, family medicine, and state licensure requirements. Supports a full range of Addiction Medicine Services.

Will at least spend 51% of time on direct mental health patient care and/or mental health clinical management.

Must maintain all basic readiness standards as required by the U.S. Public Health Service.

PHS officers assigned under this Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) must remain available for PHS deployments. Under this MOA, PHS officers are not authorized to deploy with the military.

Requirements:

License: A current, unrestricted, and valid license from a U.S. State (as defined in 42 USC 201 (f)) is required. Residency Trained and Board Certified by the AOA or ABMS. Certified or has eligibility to be board certified by the American Board of Addiction Medicine (ABAM).

Additional Requirements:

Must have ten years of clinical practice.

Initial assignment term is a 3-year obligation, with the option to extend.
