JOB DESCRIPTION:

This position is located in the Mental Health Directorate, Naval Medical Center, San Diego. The work may be performed within mental health units in the immediate San Diego area as assigned. The Mental Health Directorate provides a wide range of outpatient and inpatient clinical services to active duty military personnel and other beneficiaries in the San Diego Area, including psychological evaluations, crisis intervention, psychological consultation, psychological testing, and psychotherapy, all within the context of multidisciplinary medical-model teams.

DUTIES

- Evaluate, diagnose, and treat the full range of adult patients with disorders described in the Diagnostic and Statistical Manual of Mental Disorders (DSM-IV) and functions as an authoritative source of information regarding the use and interpretation of psychological and intellectual tests.
- Possibility of providing ongoing supervision and training in diagnosis and treatment to interns in the department's American Psychological Association-accredited predoctoral internship program in clinical psychology.
- Participate in and, as assigned, oversee program education, process improvement, and various managed care processes.
- Generate and maintain a variety of clinical records and reports.
- Attend staff meetings, conferences, and trainings as assigned by a higher authority, and may assume leadership of these activities.

At least 51% of the incumbent's time will be spent on direct mental health patient care and/or mental health clinical management.

REQUIREMENTS:

Ph.D. or Psy.D. in clinical or counseling psychology from graduate school accredited by the American Psychological Association. One year internship in clinical psychology accredited by the American Psychological Health Association. Licensure for independence clinical practice of psychology from any of the 50 U.S. states, the District of Columbia, the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico, Guam, or the U.S. Virgin Islands. Able to meet all requirements for Core Privileges for independent practice of clinical psychology, as delineated in BUMED instruction 6310.66E. Experience with empirically-supported psychotherapy for PTSD, as well as depressive and anxiety disorders (preferred).

Secret Clearance required.

Minimum 3 year commitment.
