

**Job Title:**

NAVY: Clinical Psychologist - The Naval Center for Combat and Operational Stress Control (NCCOSC) in Bureau of Surgery and Medicine (BUMED) San Diego, CA (O-5 billet, Non-Supervisory)

**Job Description:**

The psychologist performs psychological evaluations and clinical care. In addition, the psychologist will assist the Director in day to day oversight of NCCOSC functions.

- a. Psychological evaluations. The psychologist provides psychological assessment, and consultation services in Deployment Health.
- b. Individual psychotherapy. The psychologist plans and conducts patient interventions.
- c. Administration. The psychologist is responsible for generating and maintaining a variety of clinical records and reports in keeping with pre-established criteria, completing morbidity reports and other records of services delivered, providing quality assessment data as requested, and establishing liaison with line commands and military and civilian agencies as necessary in the implementation of interviews and dispositions.
- d. Oversight. The psychologist assists the Director in the execution of NCCOSC's mission by providing additional military expertise, collaboration, and oversight of Directorate projects which aim to educate service members, decrease stigma, build resilience, aid research, and promote best practices in the treatment of combat and operational stress injuries. The incumbent may serve as acting director in the Director's absence, assist in the facilitation of completion of special tasks assigned to NCCOSC by higher authority, and chair special subcommittees required for the accomplishment of the mission.
- e. Other. Performs other duties as assigned.

Will at least spend 51% of time on direct mental health patient care and/or mental health clinical management (deployment health).

Maintains all basic readiness standards as required by the U.S. Public Health Service. Requires a Secret clearance.

PHS officers assigned under this Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) must remain available for PHS deployments. Under this MOA, PHS officers are not authorized to deploy with the military.

**Requirements:**

License: A current, unrestricted, and valid clinical psychologist license from a U.S. State (as defined in 42 USC 201 (f)) is required.

**Additional Requirements:**

Initial assignment term is a 3-year obligation, with the option to extend.
