NCR MD: Psychologist (O-4, Supervisory) - Fort Belvoir, VA

Job Description:

Supervisory, 0-4, Clinical Psychologist position located with the Directorate of Behavioral Health at Fort Belvoir Community Hospital, Fort Belvoir, Virginia. The Directorate of Behavioral Health provides a broad range of behavioral health clinical services to military beneficiaries within the National Capital Region. The Supervisory Psychologist will:

- Provide individual, family and/or group psychotherapy;
- Formulate clinical problem lists and treatment plans consistent with professional guidelines and medical treatment facility Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs);
- Provide crisis intervention; consulting and conferring with Department of Defense (DoD) consultants and other providers as appropriate;
- Provide psychological advice on the telephone as appropriate;
- Complete required paperwork in accordance with relevant SOPs;
- Conduct assessment and treatment planning in a timely and appropriate manner; utilizing paraprofessionals after having received appropriate authorizations; and providing tele-psychology evaluations.
- Performs intake evaluations and provides treatment to beneficiaries of all age ranges, using individual and group modalities and recognized treatment strategies based upon accepted theories, principles, and practices; and participates in multi-disciplinary treatment team collaboration (i.e., social workers, psychiatrists, nurses, and psychological technicians).
- Patients and their families come from extremely diverse socio-cultural backgrounds, possess both medical and non-medical histories, and represent a wide range of unique, difficult, and complex problems.
- Serves as a primary consultant to medical treatment facility for issues related to military-specific and military-unique aspects of psychological practice to include, but not be limited to command-directed evaluations.
- Performs psychological testing and completes associated reports.

SUPERVISORY DUTIES: Evaluate work performance of subordinates and/or trainees; Give advice, counsel, or instruction to employees on both work and administrative matters; Interview candidates for positions in the unit; Recommend appointment, promotion, or reassignment to such positions; Hear and resolve complaints from employees and/or trainees, referring group grievances and more serious unresolved complaints to a higher level supervisor or manager;

The ideal candidate will also have experience working with a military population and must have an active and unrestricted license. This is a unique opportunity to join a talented and multidisciplinary mental health team located within a world-class facility that is dedicated to serving the nation's active duty and their family members.

Requirements:

License: A doctoral degree (PhD or PsyD) in clinical psychology from an APA-accredited university or professional psychology program, have completed an APA accredited internship/residency in clinical psychology. A current, unrestricted, and valid psychologist license from a U.S. State (as defined in 42 USC 201 (f)) is required.

Additional Requirements:

Maintains basic readiness standards as required by the U.S. Public Health Service. PHS officers assigned under this Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) must remain available for PHS deployments. Under this MOA, PHS officers are not authorized to deploy with the military. 3-year (minimum) assignment tour.
