JOB DESCRIPTION

Specific duties and responsibilities include, but are not limited to the following:

Serves as Advanced Practice Psychiatric Nurse Practitioner for Department of Behavioral Health (DBH) under the leadership of Chief, DBH/Installation Director of Psychological Health. Provides a wide range of services to patients with acute and severe psychiatric diagnoses and behavioral health related conditions. Services perform are a combination of advance practice nursing and psychiatric services. Diagnose, conduct therapy, and prescribe medications for patients who have psychiatric disorders, medical organic brain disorders or substance abuse problems. Provide emergency psychiatric services, psychosocial and physical assessment of patients, treatment plans, and manage patient care. Serve as consultant to Army leaders. Educate patients, family members, and staff on psychiatric diagnoses, including differential diagnosis of medical disorders with psychiatric symptoms, and on medication treatment for psychiatric disorders.

Essential job functions are as follows:

- Provide behavioral healthcare to Army patients with psychiatric diagnosis.
- Take medical histories, performs tests as needed, and administers injections.
- Provide assessments, crisis response, medication, direct behavioral health services, and medical record documentation in accordance with Department of Army, US Army Medical Command and MTF regulations and policies.
- Develop working relationships with primary care, other healthcare providers, clinics and community resources.
- Serve as lead staff person on an as-needed basis as directed by Chief, Behavioral Health or program manager.

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- Evaluate complaints of an acute and chronic nature.
- Participates in special projects/performs other duties as assigned.
- Complies with productivity standards outlined in current OTSG/MEDOM policy.

Maintains all basic readiness standards as required by the U.S. Public Health Service. PHS officers assigned under this Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) must remain available for PHS deployments. Under this MOA, PHS officers are not authorized to deploy with the military.

CONDITIONS OF EMPLOYMENT

Advanced practice nurse who meets the following: good professional standing; masters; postgraduate or doctoral degree from a family psychiatric nurse practitioner program accredited by the CCNE or the ACEN; current, active license to practice in the U.S; and experience and expertise in prescribing medication for psychiatric conditions. Experience working in DoD/Army preferred.
